Reporting Requirements

All States and territories, and metropolitan cities and counties with a population that exceeds 250,000 residents that are recipients of State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF) awards are required to produce a Recovery Plan Performance Report (the "Recovery Plan"). The Recovery Plan provides information on the recipient's projects and how they plan to ensure program outcomes are achieved in an effective and equitable manner. It will include key performance indicators identified by the recipient and some mandatory indicators identified by Treasury. Each annual Recovery Plan must be posted on the public-facing website of the recipient by or on the same date that the recipient submits the report to Treasury.

The initial Recovery Plan will cover the period from the date of award to July 31, 2021 and must be submitted to Treasury by August 31, 2021. Thereafter, the Recovery Plan will cover a 12-month period and recipients will be required to submit the report to Treasury within 30 days after the end of the 12-month period (by July 31).

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GENERAL OVERVIEW

Executive Summary

Spokane County has a population of approximately 539,339 people and is currently the 4th largest County in the State of Washington. Spokane County encompasses about 1,781 square miles and has 9 cities, 4 towns, and 37 unincorporated communities. Spokane County was awarded a total of \$101,547,383.00 in funds under the American Rescue Plan (ARP). In May 2021, Spokane County received \$50,773,69.50 which was half of its total ARP award. Spokane County Commissioners Josh Kerns, Mary L. Kuney, and Al French will be seeking extensive public input on how the ARP funds should be spent.

It is the intent of the Spokane County Commissioners to gather public input through a variety of forums such as: work groups, public meetings, online survey's, and through direct correspondence with citizens. Spokane County Commissioners and staff understand the need to ensure that there is a clear picture of where the current gaps are in the community, before making any formal decisions about how the ARP funds will be spent. Spokane County leadership is committed to putting these funds to work in the community as quickly as possible, however, it will likely take a few months to gather information and begin making funding decisions.

Spokane County's goal through this process is to ensure that ARP funds are spent on projects that are sustainable, lack other ARP funding eligibility, provide resources to the underserved communities, prepare for future pandemic-like emergencies, and restore the public health and economic resiliency of our community and its residents.

Uses of Funds

Spokane County currently has no planned use of the ARP funds. Spokane County is in the process of developing a plan to gather and evaluate community input as well as identifying a process for reviewing proposals when such time comes, as we are ready to accept them.

Promoting equitable outcomes

Spokane County currently has no planned projects using ARP funds. Once Spokane County enacts the plan to gather and evaluate community input as well as review proposals, Commissioners and staff will remain aware and adhere to the equitable outcomes in required categories and will report on these in the future, if necessary, based on allocations of ARP funds.

Community Engagement

Spokane County is in the midst of creating a final plan for seeking Community Engagement. It is a high priority for Spokane County to developing a Community Engagement Plan that efficiently and equitably captures the need and opportunities present in our region.

It is the intent of the Spokane County Commissioners to gather public input through a variety of forums such as: work groups, public meetings, online survey's, and through direct correspondence with citizens. When the Commissioners and staff are ready to accept input and proposals, significant communications will be deployed into the community to provide notification of such. Spokane County Commissioners and staff understand the need to ensure that there is a clear picture of where the current gaps are in the community, before making any formal decisions about how the ARP funds will be spent.

Labor Practices
